KEEP AWAKE

The phrase "keep awake" shows up several times in Mark's gospel. During this season of Advent, the weeks leading up to the celebration of Christmas, most people don't really need to be told to "Keep awake!" Many of us may already be operating in a state of sleep deprivation. We're startled into extra wakefulness with dinners, gift buying, parties, or school holiday programs. There's more risk of us being over-caffeinated or overscheduled than overly sleepy.

But maybe Mark's words are an invitation to a different kind of wake-up call. The promise of Advent is that God is always at work in the world, bringing new beginnings and new life to all people. So this Advent season, amidst all sorts of busyness, keep awake and be watchful for the surprising ways God shows up in the world. Look for the presence of Christ. This is a way of being awake and alert that might actually be restful and give us peace.
