St. Paul fourth-graders are preparing for their First Communion on Maundy Thursday, April 13.

Communion, they learn, is one important part of faith - giving us Christ's promise of real presence as well as the forgiveness he offers. Through this meal, we are strengthened in faith and receive forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation. From this meal, we are sent to bear the grace of God to the world.

Communion is one of two sacraments in the

Lutheran faith - the other is baptism.

Communion and baptism are something Jesus commanded us to do, use a physical element, and give us God's grace, love, and forgiveness.

Most importantly, each child learns that communion is the body of Christ, given for each of us, and the blood of Christ shed for each of us. Jesus is very specific: He does more than love *people* – he loves *each of us*. He does more than give his body and blood for *people* – he gives them for *each of us*.
