PAY ATTENTION

Jesus was a keen observer of the natural world, and he used what he noticed to teach his followers about the ways of God. "Look at the birds of the air," or, "Consider the lilies of the field," he said. These sayings lead to some of his most important teachings about what it means to live according to the alternative values of the kingdom of God.

Last week, the gospel reading was a story Jesus told about a farmer who planted seed indiscriminately. This week, Jesus tells a story about wheat and weeds growing in the same field. It's a similar story, but also very different. These stories call us to pay close attention, both to what Jesus says and also to the world around us. "The heavens are telling the glory of God," says Psalm 19, and Jesus shows us that things growing from the earth have plenty of wisdom to share, too, if we have eyes to see and ears to hear.
