

WHAT IS ST. PAUL?

St. Paul Lutheran Church (ELCA) is a central-city congregation of 3,500 people who come from all over the Quad Cities region. We are a vibrant community shaped around five core values: radical hospitality, passionate worship, intentional faith formation, adventurous mission and service, and extravagant generosity.

WHO COMES TO ST. PAUL?

People who are brand new to Christianity, or growing from it for a lifetime, stream through the doors every week. Our congregation is home to people from all sorts of backgrounds and denominations. Everyone matters at St. Paul. No exceptions.

WHAT ABOUT THE WORSHIP?

Christians express their gratitude to God through worship. We believe in inspiring worship that is passionately God-centered. Four worship services anchor each weekend. Saturdays: 5:30 p.m. Sundays: 8, 9:20, and 11:45 a.m., a contemporary service. Summer Sundays (starting May 22): 8, 9:20, and 11 a.m.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT INSIDE ST. PAUL?

Expect to meet a lot of people who care about each other. The connecting places inside the main south parking lot entrance feel a bit like a town square. You'll find a crossroads of activity where the Sanctuary, bookstore, offices, and classrooms intersect. Staff and hosts wearing a lanyard and a smile are there to greet and assist you. You never have to walk far to fuel up at St. Paul. Look for the long central refreshment counter and mobile coffee carts.

Parking is available in the church lots on the south and west sides of the campus (see map). Overflow parking is available at Madison School, Vander Veer Park, and residential side streets.

WILL MY KIDS FIND A PLACE?

St. Paul is crawling with children and youth ministries. Kids are a special part of worship. Children's messages (with inspiration for grown-ups too!) are included in the 9:20 and 11:45 a.m. Sunday services. Kids' bags with soft toys, books, and crayons can be borrowed at the Sanctuary entrance.

Staffed childcare is available all Sunday morning as needed. If a child needs a break from worship, parents can step out and hear the service through broadcast speakers.

HOW DO I GET INVOLVED?

There are countless ways to grow and engage your Christian life. 
ST. PAUL CAMPUS MAP
