CELEBRATING THE HOLY SPIRIT

"A sound, like a violent rushing wind" (Acts 2). This is how the Holy Spirit's arrival is described in the New Testament book of Acts. The Holy Spirit doesn't come knocking, or wait politely to be invited, or show up in the form of a dove. The Holy Spirit rushes in, shakes things up in ways that are jarring and unknown. Tongues of fire descend on people and suddenly they can understand each other in new ways. Life on Earth takes a divinely unexpected turn. Often we expect the Holy Spirit to act in tame, toned-down ways. A violent rushing wind and fire don't seem to be on the agenda. But God's ways are vastly different from what we can imagine. This Pentecost, let's keep our eyes and ears open for the Spirit working in new ways.
