UNTAMED JESUS

Today we read about the very first action that Jesus did as part of his ministry - he taught with authority, and with that authority, cast out a demon. But here is the thing with this Jesus, we don't first meet him wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger like some of our other Gospels, but Mark's Jesus has come to tell us that with God's reign set loose on the world, our understanding of authority and power gets turned upside down.

In C.S. Lewis' The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, Aslan (the lion, who is the Christ figure) is depicted as being good, but untamed. This is the Jesus that we meet today in Mark. The untamed Jesus who comes to teach with authority, cast out demons, and break down those things that get in our way from loving God. Sometimes being a Christian isn't always easy because it forces us to go against the status quo. So think about how we, too, can be good untamed Christians.
