FRAGILE: HANDLE WITH CARE

Today we will read a snippet of 2 Corinthians in which the author says that we have a gift of treasure from God, and that we are holding this treasure in clay jars. Is this really the best place to keep treasure? Doesn't clay break easily? But this metaphor is less of a warning against our mishandling of God's gift and more of a description of God's unfailing love.

Our lives are fragile. We could easily be overwhelmed by the death, violence, hatred, and loneliness that run rampant in this world. But even when everything around us seems to be falling apart, God holds us in arms of comfort and peace. The treasure we have is this promise. And we cling to it on our best days and our worst.


