ALWAYS REFORMING

October 31st isn't just about ghosts and goblins and Halloween treats. The day also holds significance for the Christian church. On that day 501 years ago, Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses (statements) to the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. It was this act that helped begin the movement in world history known as the Reformation.

What is the Reformation? It's about asking questions, wondering together about God, studying scripture, and challenging the so-called "politics" of religion. The next time you walk past the large, main doors of the sanctuary, take a closer look. You might notice a number of divots within the doors — 95 of them, in fact. They represent the number of Luther's statements originally posted over five centuries ago. A reminder that even today, we're still re-forming our faith.

The St. Paul corner of the world is a beautiful place. But with a location near busy streets, businesses, and schools, litter and debris accumulates.


