#### **MARY'S SONG**

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." That's the first line of what is often affectionately referred to as "Mary's Song" or the Magnificat. As she visits Elizabeth, Mary can't help but break into song. It's no "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" or "Jingle Bell Rock," and yet it's the perfect song to hear on this final weekend in Advent.

Mary's song displays genuine trust in God—even in the midst of some pretty daunting circumstances. Like an aria in an opera or a duet in a musical, the Magnificat stops the action of the Gospel in order to celebrate the greatness and faithfulness of God. Mary's song is a great example of faith for all of us.


