WHY BAPTIZE?

In the Lutheran Church, we baptize people so that they can become a part of something extraordinary; not so that they might avoid some hellish peril. While many Christians unwittingly embrace a theology of fear, mostly because that's what they learned somewhere – "If I don't get my child baptized, she's going to hell" – that line of reasoning isn't biblical. It certainly doesn't build a free and faithful life.

Jesus spent his ministry embodying promise as a way of life, not threat. Threat had nothing to do with his method for convincing people to want to be baptized. Today, when we baptize, we think of our life as not only joined forever to the Lord (a relationship sealed by the Holy Spirit); we also see ourselves as bound up with other Christians around the world – our true brothers and sisters.

Have you been baptized? If not, speak with a pastor to learn more about the joy of the baptized life.


