ANASTASIS

If you attend an Orthodox church, especially in Russia or the Near East, you won't find chairs or pews in the sanctuary. You'll be expected to stand. Sometimes for two hours (or more). Why? The reason is actually rooted in the word "resurrection." The New Testament word for resurrection is anastasis, which means: stand up! Resurrection-minded Christians are those who take a stand for and against important things.

As Lutheran Christians, we do our fair share of standing during worship. We stand for song and when we receive communion. We stand because we feel the life God breathes into us. It's a resurrection posture. Standing—or sitting up, if physically unable to stand—is hardly an empty or meaningless act. It's our tangible way of proclaiming the resurrecting work of God.
