WOMEN IN MINISTRY

Today's sermon focuses on feminine imagery for God found in the Bible – a helpful complement to the masculine imagery that has dominated church language for centuries. Male exclusive descriptions of God fail to do justice to the fullness of scripture, just as they foster misunderstanding about the proper place of women in ministry. A decade ago, Jimmy Carter addressed the Parliament of World Religions with these poignant words regarding women in ministry:

"This view that the Almighty considers women to be inferior to men is not restricted to one religion or tradition ... Women are prevented from playing a full and equal role in many faiths, creating an environment in which violations against women are justified.

"The truth is that male religious leaders have had – and still have – an option to interpret holy teachings either to exalt or subjugate women. They have, for their own selfish ends, overwhelmingly chosen the latter."

Lutheran Christians (ELCA) are proud to embrace a God who transcends all gender, and men and women as full and equal partners in ministry.
