The goal specifically is to help people identify and understand the symptoms of anxiety and encourage them to reach out for help.

Angst screens in schools, communities, and theaters around the world. The film and corresponding materials provide tools, resources, and above all, hope.

Screenings will be held at 10:20 a.m. in Luther Loft and at 6:30 p.m. in the Chapel. Both are free and open to the public.

Anxiety disorders are the most common mental health challenge in the U.S., impacting 54 percent of females and 46 percent of males, with age seven being the median age of onset, according to the World Health Organization. While anxiety disorders are highly treatable, only one-third of those suffering receive treatment.
